




Welcome to Zagreb

We are honoured and pleased to invite you to the 2009 European Karate Championships in Zagreb, Croatia's capital, which will take place from 8 to 10 May 2009.

These Championships will be an opportunity to display once again the beauty of this sport which brings together athletes from all over Europe, and connects countries both off and on the tatami. It will also be an opportunity for the citizens of Zagreb to show their hospitality, and for spectators to express once again their support and enthusiasm.



A Brief History of Zagreb

Today's Zagreb has grown out of two medieval settlements that had been developing for centuries on the neighbouring hills. The first written mention of the city dates from 1094, when a diocese was founded on Kaptol, while in 1242 - neighbouring Gradec was proclaimed a free and royal city. Both settlements were surrounded by high walls and towers, the remains of which are still preserved.

During the Turkish onslaughts on Europe, between the 14th and 18th centuries, Zagreb was an important border fortress. The Baroque reconstruction of the city in the 17th and 18th centuries changed the appearance of the city. The old wooden houses were demolished and opulent palaces, monasteries and churches were built. Many trade fairs, revenues from landed estates and offerings of many craft workshops greatly contributed to the wealth of the city. Affluent aristocratic families, royal officials, church dignitaries and rich traders from all over Europe moved into the city. Schools and hospitals were opened, and the ways of European capitals were adopted.





The city outgrew its medieval borders and spread to the lowlands. The first parks and country houses were built. Zagreb affirmed its position as the administrative, cultural and economic centre of Croatia.



When Kaptol, Gradec and the surrounding settlements were administratively integrated into the City of Zagreb in 1850, its development became even faster. The disastrous earthquake of 1880 sparked off the reconstruction and modernization of many shabby neighbourhoods and buildings. Prestigious public buildings were erected, parks and fountains created, and transportation and other infrastructure built.

In the 19th century the population increased tenfold. The twentieth century brought the Secession style to Zagreb. It was a rich civil society, with firm links with all central European centres. With an increased wealth and the growth of industry from the 1960s on, the city spread out over the wide plains alongside the Sava River, where a new, contemporary business city developed, ready to face the challenges of the third millennium.







VISITOR INFORMATION

Zagreb is the capital of Croatia, one of Europe's youngest countries – a parliamentary democracy that adopted its constitution in 1990 and was internationally recognized in 1992. In terms of geography, culture and history, it lies at the very heart of Europe.

LANGUAGE



The official language is Croatian. Many people, especially young, speak English.

WEATHER



Inland Croatia has a continental climate, warm in the summer, cold in the winter. May temperature in Zagreb is about 26°C.

TIME DIFFERENCES



GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) + 1 hour. during March to October GMT + two hours.

ELECTRICITY



The voltage in Croatia is 220 V, 50 Hz, the same as in the majority of European countries.

CURRENCY & EXCHANGE



1 € = 7.340 kn (*February 5th 2009*)

The Croatian currency unit is *KUNA*. Coins are 1, 2 *KUNA*; coin and paper bill: 5 *KUNA*, paper bills: 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, 1000 *KUNA*. 1 *KUNA* contains 100 *LIPA*. Coins are 1,2,5,10,20 and 50. Foreign currencies can be exchanged for the local money at banks, official exchange offices, post offices, etc.





BANKING HOURS



Many bank branches and exchange offices are usually open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. non-stop (Monday - Friday), and from 8 a.m. to noon (Saturdays). Most of the banks have cash machines (ATMs) which operate 24 hours a day. Banks at the Airport are open every day (including Sundays and holidays) from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

POST OFFICE



Post boxes in Croatia are yellow, with collection times indicated on them. The main Post Office in Zagreb is located in Jurišićeva 13, with opening hours from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday- Friday and from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays.

OPENING HOURS



Government offices work from 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Most shops and department stores are open non-stop from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturdays.

TIPPING



A "service charge" is already included in restaurant bills, but it is customary to "round up" the bill in a restaurant (unless just ordering a drink). For special services rendered by hotel personnel, tips are usually between 10-50 KUNA.

TAX-FREE SHOPPING



A tourist whose purchases exceed 500 KUNA may claim a PDV (VAT) return for all goods except petroleum products when leaving the country, with TAX CHEQUE receipts verified by the Croatian Customs Office. Time limit for tax refunds is one year.





CREDIT CARDS



All major credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, Eurocard/Master Card, Visa, JCB and Eurocheques are advertised at points of sale, and are normally accepted throughout Croatia.

LIQUOR LAWS



The minimum legal drinking age in Croatia is 18 years.

TELEPHONE



Public telephone boxes accept only phone cards available in post-offices and convenience stores.

To make a call to Zagreb (to Croatia) from abroad, dial your international access code and **385** for Croatia and than the telephone number.

The GSM mobile phone system is available. Please check compatibility with your operator.

MEDICAL SERVICES:



No vaccinations or health certificates are required for entering Croatia. Health insurance policy is optional.

Pharmacies are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

In case of an accident or an illness call an ambulance free-of-charge from any phone: **94**.

ZAGREB AIRPORT



Zagreb International Airport at Pleso is about 30 minutes away from the city centre by car and can be reached by bus or taxi. Croatia Airlines operate a bus service from Zagreb Bus Station, with buses running half-hourly to hourly from 4 a.m. to 7 p.m. Time of departure depends on the flights. Return buses from the airport have about the same schedule. Taxi price from the airport to the city centre ranges between 150-200 KUNA.

TRANSPORT TO/FROM HOTELS - SPORTS HALL




CHAMPIONSHIPS' VENUE

The Championships will take place in Dom Sportova Zagreb from 8 to 10 May 2009. The capacity of the Stadium is 5,000 seats, with the area surface of 70×40 metres. It is situated just in front of the HQ hotel (100 m). The Arena has hosted many great sports events, such as the World Table Tennis Championships, European Ice-Skating Championships, World Ice Hockey Division A Championships, ATP Zagreb Open, etc.



On the days of competition, a restaurant in Dom Sportova Zagreb offers lunch from $1:00\,$ p.m. to $4:00\,$ p.m. at the price of **6-10** $\mathbf C$ per person. Lunch tickets are available at the stand of the Croatian Karate Union in Dom Sportova Zagreb, on the registration and competition days, for cash payment.







REGISTRATION OF DELEGATION

The Registration for all athletes and officials will take place in the Headquarters hotel Four Points Sheraton – Panorama Hotel **** on Thursday, 7 May 2009 between 10:00 a.m. and 04:00 p.m. in the Zagreb Room.

Each Delegation should bring an audio recording of their national anthem and two (2) national flags.

SECRETARIAT

All delegations are kindly requested to fill in the attached Registration and Competition Entry Forms and return them to the Organizing Committee within the set deadline.

The Secretariat will be located in one of the conference halls at **Four Points Sheraton – Panorama Hotel** **** on the 1st floor. There is a possibility of accrediting an official press/media representative during the registration.

PRESS ACCREDITATION

Press accreditation can only be granted to persons who apply for it in advance and who are able to prove they are journalists.

The press centre is adjacent to the journalist stands and seats. Accredited journalists will have access to working seats, telephone and fax. There is a wireless Internet connection in Dom Sportova Zagreb. A press conference will be hold with the prize winners. The mix zone will also be organized.

Photographers and TV or video camerapersons will have access to their allocated seats only upon presenting their special cards, received within the accreditation procedure. Journalists and photographers will not have access to the competition area. Permits for video recording will be issued by the European Karate Federation, with the payment on the spot during the accreditation procedure.

TRAINING

The organizers will provide the National Federations that submit the relevant application in time with training facilities prior to the days of Championships (Wednesday, April 8^{th,} and Thursday, May 9th) in Dom Sportova Zagreb. The application must be received before **15 March 2009** via e-mail: karate.tajnistvo@zq.t-com.hr

Training area and transport for the training participants will be arranged at a nominal price. **Transport will only be available from the official hotels.**

ENTRANCE TICKETS

The organizer (Croatian Karate Union) will provide the National Federations with a quota of entrance tickets for the European Championships at the following special low rate of $\mathbf{10} \ \mathbf{\mathbb{C}}$ per person for the entire competition period of three (3) days.

FAREWELL PARTY

The participants will get information on the Farewell Party at Info desk during the Championships.

PROTECTION

WKF Kumite Rules, Article 2, point 8, state that the following protective equipment is compulsory for competitors:

8.1. WKF (EKF) approved mitts, one contestant wearing red and other wearing blue.





- 8.2. Gum shield
- 8.3. The female chest protector approved by WKF (EKF)
- 8.4. The shin pads approved by the WKF (EKF)
- 8.5. The foot protection approved by WKF (EKF)

Groin Guards are not mandatory, but if worn, must be of approved WKF (EKF) type.

INSURANCE

All participants and members of delegations must effectuate their own medical insurance and personal trip insurance. The Croatian Karate Union and the European Karate Federation are assuming no liability for those.

The chiefs of delegations have to sign the enclosed terms of responsibility and return them by **15 March 2009**.


